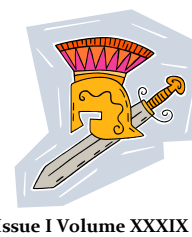

After the three preliminary rounds ended, we had a spot in the semifinals round. We were the number eight seed so we had to face the two seed and five seed. We were up against Virginia and Illinois, two very formidable opponents. Ironically enough, it was an exact rematch of last year's 2012 Advanced Certamen Finals. Before the round, we listened to an inspirational video sent to us by Kyle, the little brother of our coach Michael Howard. He told us to go out there and play the game we know how to play, be smart, and have fun. Motivated, we walked into the room, sat in our seats and when the moderator said it was time to get started, the room was silent. Throughout the round, amazing buzzes were made across the board. When it was all said and done, we had made it to the finals to face Florida and California.

Fast forward to the morning of Finals. We did some light preparation but mostly relaxed and stayed calm. Kyle sent us a video that said that an opportunity like this doesn't come around very often so not only stay focused but remember to enjoy our time on the stage. We took our seats and the moderator began. We started off by claiming four out of the five tossups which included sharp buzzes from Meghana on mythology, Jeffrey on literature and history, and me on grammar. Florida and California fought back. However, by the end of the round, we had claimed the victory. This championship is the first ever Advanced Certamen National Championship that Massachusetts has ever claimed. The four of us could not have done it without our coaches Ms. Hausey, Michael Howard, Francesca Fontin, and Griffin Metto. We also were inspired by our past Certamen coach and Certamen god Mr. Cox as well as a lot of past Certamen players including Dylan Drolette, Grace Thomas, Patrick Londa, Chris Londa, Derek Booth, Jacob Meister, and Isaac Meister. Meghana, Jeffrey, Chris, and I would like to thank all of you from the bottom of our hearts. It was not an easy thing to do, and we did it thanks to you. The \$1000 cash prize was donated to the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

the year before. You may think it's difficult to make a team out of players who had been fighting for the State title all year,

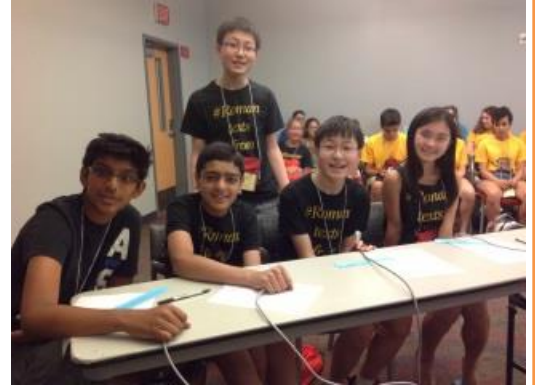
but something about discussing the existence of the subjective genitive or the skin color of Septimius Severus can bring anyone together. Zeus and Hera, you should try it some time☺.

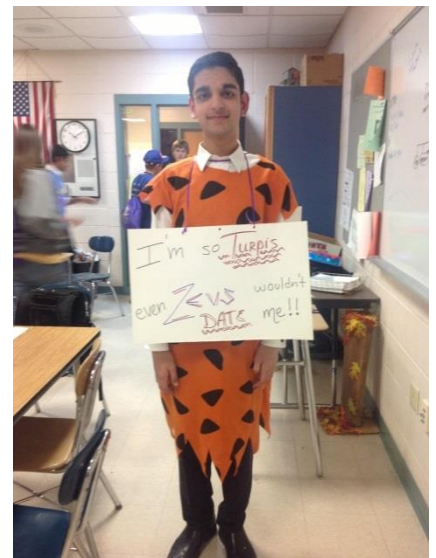
tournament. But most all, I would never have known that at the ending of my final term as a MassJCL officer, I would be so overwhelmed by nostalgia.

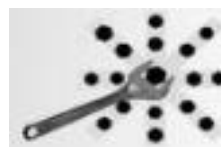
