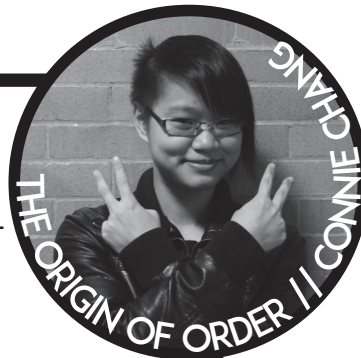

The annual Kickoff Event took place on October 25 at Mt. Greylock Regional High. Students enjoyed a wide variety of activities, including the Yellow Submarine Improv Troupe, *Certamen* scrimmages, tours of the Clark Museum, SPQM [*senatus populusque Massachusetts*], worm and hula hoop scrimmages, officer workshops

and catapult contests. For many, Kickoff is all about the catapults, and Mt. Greylock is no exception to the rule.

Kickoff is the one time during the year that our school doesn't have to travel, and it makes all the difference in our competition. This year, we started set-up of our catapult the week before Kickoff. With this added benefit, Mt. Greylock was able to make many adjustments to optimize the

distance of the projectile.

For our catapult, we break up the process into three phases: planning, construction, and testing.

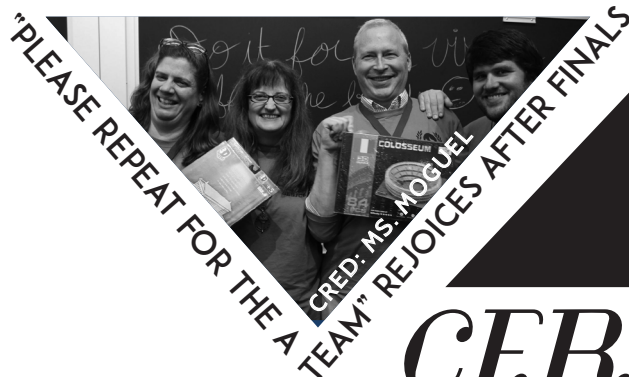
During planning, we start by drawing up a basic idea of what we want to do and the measurements of the catapult. We then determine what materials, and how many of them, we need. Once we

have our materials, we assemble the catapult exactly as it was drawn on our initial design. Once it is assembled, we make changes as needed.

Testing is vital to the building process so that you are able to fix the kinks before the day of the competition. One of our priorities was to cre-

ate the catapult in a way that it could be broken down into small pieces easily for transportation purposes. We also got the help of a physics teacher who was apt in using power tools and other equipment to help with the planning and construction process.

When most hear the word *Certamen*, they think of a highly competitive game where JCLers try to answer questions with lightning speed. On October 4, at Boston University, *Certamen* took on new meaning as Latin teachers, SCLers and *Certamen* coaches themselves vied for supremacy in this vivifying game. In this exhilarating competition, I was privileged to moderate for these Latin enthusiasts, among whom were my own BLS teachers, in a most entertaining reversal of position. I watched as my teachers disregarded many *Certamen* regulations which they had so vehemently driven into the fabric of their students' minds. This time, we had the power to criticize them for their errors.

They demonstrated their "disobedience" by talking during the reading of a toss-up, conferring too long on *boni* and arguing with the

The hilarious interchanges between the teams and moderator cultivated great, though unanticipated, entertainment.

The 2014 annual Northeastern Elite *Certamen* ended successfully, thanks to those who brilliantly organized it. The competition is an invaluable opportunity for non-JCLers to compete in this contest of knowledge, and the participants' eagerness to return next year stands as a testament to the Northeastern Elite's distinction.

As the summer ended and eighth grade began, I started to ready myself for the beginning of another year of JCL and *Certamen*. Near the top of that agenda was the Yale Invitational *Certamen* event, which I attended on November 8.

After one very long car ride, I arrived at the Yale campus and found that I was met with an abundance of emotions. I was excited for the first *Certamen* match of the year, but I was terrified for the same reason. Going into round 1, I felt that my teammates and I had a pretty good chance, with Ashley Chao and her massive knowledge of mythology, Nicholas Weiske and his slightly unhealthy obsession of history, and lastly, John Nguyen rocking the culture and MAQs, while I had language.

By the end of the first three rounds, my team had managed to score 725 points, landing us with the first seed going into semifinals. Before semis, I was extremely nervous, because if we lost we were done, and there would be no more *Certamen* for the day. After the 15th question, we were only ahead by 40 points; it was still anyone's game. Luckily, we were able to work together as a team and win the round.

Interestingly enough, before finals, I wasn't at all nervous. However, the teams we were facing were a lot faster than us, and by tossup 5, the nerves kicked in again. The Oak Hall School from Florida only had two people, but after ten questions, we were tied with them with only 30 points. Nevertheless, we were still able to work together as a team, and

by question 15 we had pulled ahead of Florida and were just behind Basis DC by a few points.

The final places were Basis DC: first, Boston Latin School B: second, and Oak Hall: third. I wasn't sad though; we had made it that far as a team, and getting second was a huge accomplishment. In fact, finals and semis were probably two of the best matches because they were so competitive. *Certamen* is not as fun when one doesn't have a challenging opponent, and DC and Florida were definitely challenging. I cannot wait for the next tournament, and I look forward to competing, regardless of the outcome.

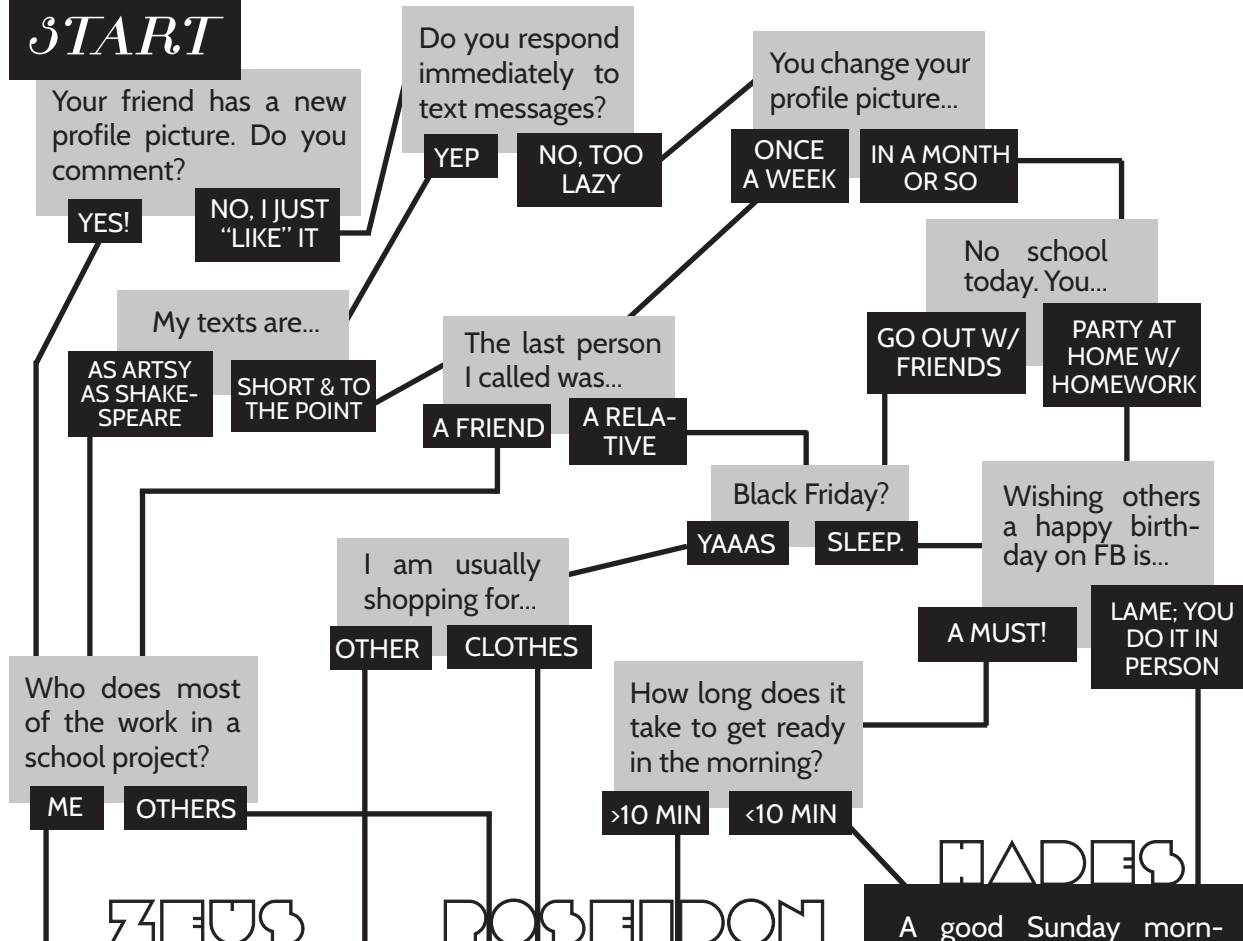

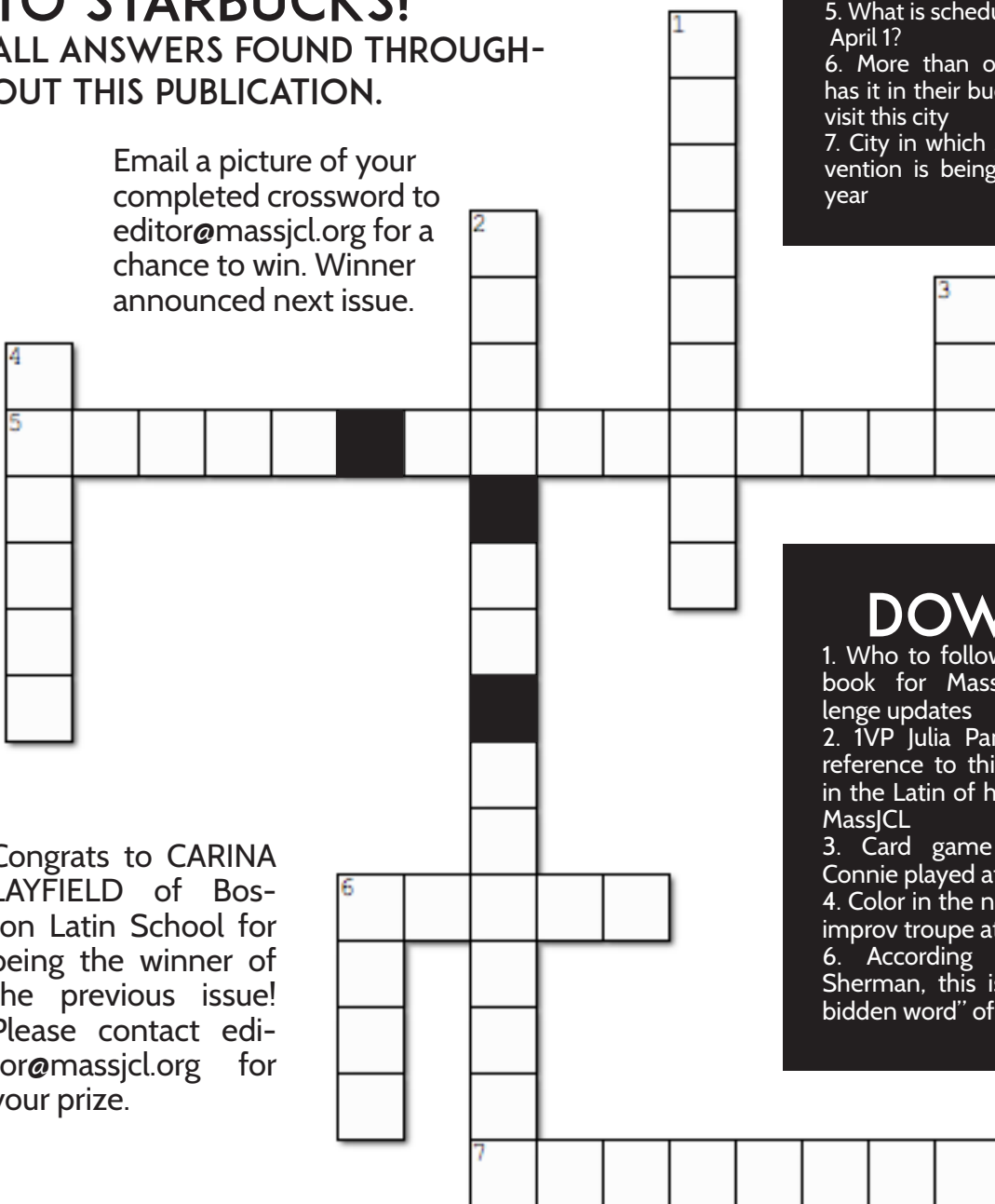

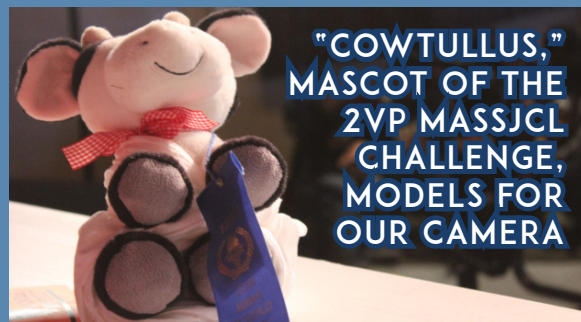
